#### **Primary Factors and Criteria**

- 1. Sound unwavering Biblical Doctrine
  - Follow Biblical truths in teachings and beliefs based on Wesleyan (Methodist) Theology
  - A welcoming church to all that exudes God's grace and love by upholding Biblical Truths
- 2. No Trust Clause
  - All property belongs entirely to local church
  - Local property cannot be leveraged against local church
- 3. Connectional in association with other likeminded churches, both near and abroad
  - Support and accountability (pastors and congregation)
  - Structure already in place
- 4. High level of local church input and decision making
  - Pastoral appointments
  - Financial spending
  - Ability to establish church leadership
- 5. Smooth transition process from UMC
  - Something the congregation can relate to
  - Familiar church culture, theology, worship practice, etc.

**TBD** 2<sup>nd</sup> Church-wide Vote – The exact date will be determined by the District Superintendent after general conference and announced at

least 10 days in advance (the church has no discretion over the date, a Sunday afternoon was requested, but this could potentially be a

weeknight).

TBD Church-wide Business Meeting – Immediately after the 2<sup>nd</sup> Church-wide vote there will be a separate meeting to discuss how the church

will move forward in light of the outcome of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Church-wide vote.

June 20 – 22<sup>nd</sup> 2024 Session of Mississippi Annual Conference (Jackson, MS)

<u>Ratifying Vote</u> – *If the 2<sup>nd</sup> Church-wide vote passes* the Annual Conference will ratify that decision at some point during the annual

conference, from that date a 30-day clock begins to have the transfer of church property back to the local congregation.

**June 30**<sup>th</sup> Effective Date by which the local church is considered "closed" as a United Methodist Church, assuming the 2<sup>nd</sup>Church-wide vote passes.

**July 1**<sup>st</sup> First Day as a non-UMC Church, assuming the 2<sup>nd</sup> Church-wide vote passes.
